Fire Chief- Chief Yerian reports that they recently taught a CPR class for St. Phillips and James. The Fire Department will have a sprinkler outreach program on May 15th from 6:00 – 8:00 p.m. at the Safety Center.

Chief Yerian asks for a voice motion from Council to accept the State Fire Marshall Equipment grant for \$2,7100.00. This will help the Fire Department purchase lighting for their trucks.

Chief Yerian reports that all of our federal grants have been submitted. Mayor Schultz asks Chief Yerian if there has been any progress with Adam Signs on putting Lawrence Township on the sign. Chief Yerian says they are waiting for better weather.

Police Chief- Monthly Report

Chief Wilson says she received a resignation notice from Hunter Anthony effective this Saturday. This coincides with the closing of our current application period and test.

Chief Wilson says the Eclipse event went really well and there were no major incidents.

Chief Wilson asks that Resolution 8-24, an agreement for the LOGIC Board, pass at the next meeting per their request. There is minor language change.

Ms. Mayberry asks about the sale of obsolete property, are they all going to be destroyed. Mr. McCallion says the Ohio Revised Code has a provision on how to get rid of items. One of the provisions says if you want to do it by internet auction, you have to have a resolution with an itemized list attached. The provided list is everything we intend to sell on govdeals.com, if it does not sell then it will be destroyed.

Engineer- No report.

Streets- Mr. Hosking reports that the Street Department has been working on patching, ditching and street repairs. Mr. Ferrebee has received all the salt that was on the list to be order.

Public Utilities- The Utility Department has been busy with testing at the sewer plant.

Planning/Zoning- There is a Board of Zoning Appeals meeting this month.

Finance Director- March Financial Report

Mr. Rouse reports that the March Income tax collections were down 1.5% compared to March of last year. Mr. Rouse says he believes this is a timing issue. Income tax is still up 3% from last year.

City Manager- Mr. Bucher thanks Stark Parks, the Schalmo Family YMCA, and The Canal Fulton Library for partnering with us for the total solar eclipse event. The Wild Yoga Studio had a yoga class during the event.

Resolution 10-24, this is in conjunction with the ODNR grant we received to build the new road. Mr. Bucher asks Council to pass this legislation under first reading in order to receive our reimbursement.

Mr. Bucher says everyone received an email about the street project bidding. The lowest bidder was Karvo, our Engineer is comfortable moving forward.

A motion was made to approve Karvo as lowest and best bidder for the 2024 street paving project by Sue Mayberry

Mayor- Mayor Schultz says the city used to have a commission on disabilities. The commission fell apart during COVID. The purpose of the commission is to identify and make sure we are meeting the needs of the special needs people in our community. Mayor Schultz says the people from Echoing Ridge reached out in hopes to get the commission active again. The next meeting is 3:30 p.m. on May 2nd at City Hall.

National Day of prayer is May 2nd. The first prayer is at the Mulhauser gazeebo at noon. The second meeting is at the St. Helena amphitheater at 7:00 p.m.

There is a Memorial Day dinner and concert on May 26th. The free dinner is at 6:00 p.m.

You can get tickets for the dinner at City Hall.

Mayor Schultz will be at the high school on May 10th working with the STEAM students who are considering an engineering career. We are using the water tower project we have in progress. The students are tasked with reviewing the engineering plans and cost.

The Fire Levy Campaign Committee is fully formed. The account is set up at Apple Creek Bank. Mayor Schultz says the goal is \$1000 for purchasing signs and door knockers.

JC Films is making a movie about the life of Brian Ziegler, a former Northwest basketball player. Brian was injured in a car accident and has an inspirational story. Brian also wrote a book.

Economic Dev. Director- Chamber Luncheon is April 25th. Timothy Dimoff is the speaker and the topic is AI.

We still have solar eclipse shirts at City Hall for \$10.

Parks Director- Bird house making class is April 24th at the Canalway Center.

There is a pickle ball camp on May 6th and May 7th.

Canalway Center is now open on the weekends. We have started to rent the paddle boats.

The St. Helena III will be taken out of the dry-dock after the Trout Derby.

Law Director- Mr. McCallion requests a brief executive session to discuss pending litigation.

<u>Resolution 6-24:</u> A Resolution by the Council of the City of Canal Fulton, Ohio Establishing the Skyview Waterline Loan Program

Ms. Mayberry apologizes. Ms. Mayberry says when this was first on the agenda she indicated that it was mentioned to be an easement and not a loan program. Ms. Mayberry says she did not pick up the document that was passed out in the executive session, which states it would be a loan program.

Ms. Mayberry asks if Aqua Ohio is involved in this. Mayor Schultz says no. Aqua Ohio does a lot more of this than we do, Mr. Dylewski reached out to them to determine what the market rate is for an easement of this size.

Ms. Mayberry asks how many homes are involved in this loan program. Mayor Schultz says 15 or16. They are all in city limits. Mr. Bucher met with one property owner who is not interested at all, they are happy with their well. Ms. Mayberry asks how we handle this. Mayor Schultz says when the property sells the new owners will be responsible.

Ms. Mayberry asks how the development of the land by the water tower is going, the Lockhart property. Ms. Mayberry asks how many homes will be built and how will we extend water and sewer to them. Mayor Schultz says the preliminary plan called for 128 homes. Ms. Mayberry says she thought it was 5 acre houses. Mayor Schultz says, no, that is what was auctioned originally.

Ms. Mayberry asks if this has gone through the Planning Commission. Mayor Schultz says, yes, we zoned it residential. Ms. Mayberry asks if they will be charged full tap in fees. Mayor Schultz says correct. Mayor Schultz says he has heard rumors that Mr. Lockhart wants to rezone 12 acres for commercial use. This would have to come back to the Planning Commission. Ms. Mayberry asks how many houses. Mayor Schultz says the original plan called for 128. Ms. Mayberry asks how much the land is for each home. Mayor Schultz says he guesses it would be \$60,000 - \$70,000. Ms. Mayberry clarifies that these will be homes. Mayor Schultz says, yes, that is how it is zoned.

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STREET CLOSURE ORDINANCE

A. This section shall apply to all special events or temporary street or sidewalk closures to be conducted within the city.

B. Definitions.

- 1. For purposes of this section, a "temporary street or sidewalk closure" shall mean any special event or similar occurrence to be conducted within any portion of a street or sidewalk located within the limits of the City, to which all owners, residents, and tenants of properties situated on or within the area give their written consent, which is solely sponsored by such owners, residents, and tenants, and is not for any commercial or advertising purposes or for profit.
- 2. For purposes of this section, a "special event" shall mean a block party, festival, parade, celebration, concert, neighborhood gathering, road race, picnic, sale, or any other large party or gathering that is advertised or promoted to others which requires a temporary street or sidewalk closure.
- 3. Any special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure authorized in whole or in part by the City for municipal purposes, including but not limited to events of general civic or public nature, is exempt from this section.

C. Permit Required.

- It shall be unlawful for a person in any way to advertise, promote, solicit, induce
 participation in, or otherwise control, organize, or arrange for, a special event or
 temporary street or sidewalk closure unless a permit has first been issued by the
 <u>City Manager</u>.
- No person shall violate the terms of a permit issued in accordance this section, nor participate in any permitted activity under this section over the objection of the permitee.
- 3. No person without a valid permit under this section shall interfere with the progress with, or orderly conduct of, a special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure in any manner.
- D. Application for a Permit. An application for a permit for a special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure shall be provided as a form by the <u>City Manager</u> and shall contain all of the following information to be completed by the applicant:

- The name, residential and business address, and phone number of each person and organization sponsoring a special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure.
 For an organization, the application shall contain such information for:
 - i. The president, chairman, or otherwise highest-ranking officer of the organization, and
 - ii. All persons having a position of management or control in such organization who are or will be engaged in advertising, promoting, soliciting, inducing participation in, or otherwise controlling, organizing, or arranging for, such special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure;
- 2. The date(s) and time(s), listed by hour, of such special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure;
- 3. The block(s), street(s), address(es), or intersection(s) in which such special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure will occur;
- 4. The estimated number of persons who will participate in or otherwise attend such special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure;
- 5. The purpose of the special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure;
- 6. Whether parking is requested to be restricted or prohibited during the special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure;
- 7. Whether charity, gratuity, or offerings will be solicited to or accepted by participants, or whether sales or of food, beverages, merchandise, or any other good will occur;
- 8. Whether alcoholic beverages will be sold, served, or otherwise provided to participants. If applicant's answer is in the affirmative, then a copy of any permit to disperse alcohol or application for such permit pursuant to R.C. Chapter 4301 shall accompany the permit application;
- 9. The written consent of each of the owners, residents, and tenants of properties situated on or within the block(s), street(s), address(es), or intersection(s) in which such special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure will occur; and
- 10. Any other information that the <u>City Manager</u> deems reasonably necessary to carry out his or her duties under this section.

- E. Fees. A nonrefundable fee to cover the administrative costs of processing the permit shall be paid to the City by the person applying for the permit at the time of filing the application. The City Manager shall determine the amount any permit fee(s).
- F. Time of Filing. The application shall be filed with the <u>City Manager</u> no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the scheduled date of such special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure. Failure to within this period is sufficient grounds for denial of a permit.
- G. Litter Collection. Applicants shall provide for the collection and removal of all trash, garbage, and little caused or arising out of such special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure.
- H. Hold Harmless. Applicants shall agree to indemnify and hold harmless the City and its councilmen, boards, commissions, officers, employees, and agents from all lawsuits, actions, damages, or legal claims to which the City may be subject to resulting from, arising out of, or caused by such special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure and any activities permitted in connection therewith. Applicants shall agree to solely assume the defense and liability of, and will pay the costs of, any such lawsuits, actions, damages, or legal claims as described herein.
- I. Conditions for Issuance of a Permit. Any permit granted under this section may contain conditions reasonably calculated to minimize any dangers or hazards at risk to pedestrian or vehicular traffic and to the public health, safety, tranquility, and welfare. Such conditions include, but are not limited to, changes in time, duration, number of participants, location, or sound.
- J. Standard for Issuance of a Permit. A permit may be issued by the <u>City Manager</u> upon his or her consideration of the application and from other information which may otherwise be obtained, and all the following conditions exist at the time the permit is issued:
 - The applicant has not knowingly and with intent to deceive made any false,
 misleading, or fraudulent statements of material fact in the application for a
 permit or in any other documents required pursuant to this section, nor has the
 applicant procured fraud or unlawful action in obtaining all requirements of the
 application for a permit;

- 2. The applicant successfully completes the application in accordance with the standards provided in this section, pays any fee required in advance, and agrees to any other conditions that are imposed in the issued permit;
- 3. The time, duration, size, and location of the special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure will not substantially disrupt the orderly or safe movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic, nor unduly disrupt the health, safety, tranquility, or welfare of citizens within the City;
- 4. The special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure will not unduly disrupt or interfere with the orderly operation of parks, hospitals, churches, schools, or other public and quasi-public institutions in the City;
- 5. The special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure will not unduly disrupt or interfere with the regular operation, undertaking, or activity of businesses, organizations, firms, storefronts, or other private enterprises in the City;
- 6. The special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure is of such nature as to comply with the law and morals of the City and any other specified goals or purposes deemed reasonably necessary by the City;
- 7. The special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure is of such nature that it will not require the diversion of so great a number of police officers of the City so as to prevent normal police protection of the city, nor unduly interfere with the movement of any emergency personnel or equipment en route to such emergencies within the City;
- 8. The applicant reasonably and in good faith informs all persons listed in subsection D of this section and all persons otherwise participating in such special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure of the terms and conditions of such issued permit and all the applicable laws thereto; and
- The special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure will not conflict with or interfere with another special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure for which a permit has been granted or any City-sponsored event, function, or occurrence.
- K. Notice of Issuance or Denial. Written notice of the issuance or denial of a permit shall be provided within ten (10) days of receipt of an application, or as soon as possible if

- received less than fourteen (14) days in advance of the proposed date of the special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure. If a permit is denied, the written notice shall state the reason(s) for denial, which may include any reason deemed necessary by the City Manager or the City, notwithstanding these provisions.
- L. Revocation of Permit. Any permit for a special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure may be revoked by the City Manager at any time upon his or her reasonable determination that the health, safety, tranquility, morals, laws, or welfare of the public or property is at risk by any reason, including but not limited to emergency, disaster, calamity, disorder, riot, traffic conditions, violation of this section or of any specific permit terms and conditions, or undue burden of public services. Notice of revocation of a permit shall be delivered in writing to at least one person named upon the permit by personal service or by certified mail, or either orally, in writing, by personal contact or service, or by telephone if such special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure has commenced and it is reasonable in ensuring prompt notice. Continuance of such special event or temporary street or sidewalk closure after such notice of revocation has been delivered is unlawful.
- M. Reservations of the City. It is the exclusive authority of the City to issue, deny, or revoke any permit under this section, and may limit or expand the circumstances, conditions, and standards of issuing a permit under this section. A permit issued under this section is ultimately subject to those certain terms and conditions specified by the <u>City Manager</u> in the issued permit, notwithstanding these provisions.
- N. Penalty. Whoever violates any provision of this section is guilty of a Fourth Degree Misdemeanor (M4).

A RESOLUTION DECLARING IT NECESSARY TO LEVY AN ADDITIONAL 1.6 MILL TAX LEVY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING FOR FIRE DEPARTMENT OPERATING AND CAPITAL EXPENSES FOR THE CITY OF CANAL FULTON, OHIO PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE SECTIONS 5705.19(I) AND 5705.191, AND REQUESTING THE STARK COUNTY FISCAL OFFICER TO CERTIFY THE TOTAL CURRENT TAX VALUATION OF THE CITY AND THE DOLLAR AMOUNT OF REVENUE THAT WOULD BE GENERATED BY THAT LEVY.

WHEREAS, this Council finds that the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation by levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of the City and that it is necessary to levy an additional 1.6 mill tax in excess of that limitation for the purpose of paying for Fire Department operating and capital expenses for the City; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Division (B) of Section 5705.03 of the Revised Code, in order to submit the question of a tax levy pursuant to Sections 5705.19(I) and 5705.191 of the Revised Code, this Council must request that the Stark County Fiscal Officer certify (i) the total current tax valuation of the City and (ii) the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the proposed levy; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Division (B) of Section 5705.03 of the Revised Code, upon receipt of a certified copy of a resolution of this Council declaring the necessity of the tax, stating its purpose, whether it is an additional levy or a renewal or a replacement of an existing tax, and the section of the Revised Code authorizing its submission to the electors, and requesting such certification, the Stark County Fiscal Officer is to certify the total current tax valuation of the City and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the proposed levy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE Council of the City of Canal Fulton, Stark County, Ohio, not less than two-thirds of all members elected thereof concurring, that:

Section 1:

This Council hereby finds, determines and declares that the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation by levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of the City, that it is therefore necessary to levy an additional 1.6 mill ad valorem property tax outside of the ten-mill limitation for the purpose of paying for Fire Department operating and capital expenses for the City, for a period of five years, and that it intends to submit the question of that additional levy to the electors of the City at an election on November 5, 2024 as authorized by Sections 5705.19(1) and 5705.191 of the Revised Code. If approved, that 1.6 mill tax would be first levied in tax year 2025, for first collection in calendar year 2026.

Section 2:

This Council requests the Stark County Fiscal Officer to certify to it both (i) the total current tax valuation of the City and (ii) the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the additional levy specified in Section 1.

Section 3:

The Clerk of Council is directed to deliver a certified copy of this Resolution to the Stark County Fiscal Officer.
